1. Terminal 6: Construction Barricades Removed

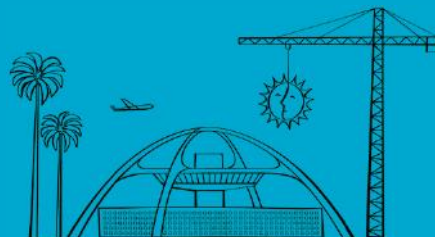
- Construction barricades around Bag Claim #1 in Terminal 6, Arrivals Level are scheduled to be removed on Friday, September 20
- Bag Claim #1 will re-open once all barricades are removed
- Barricading is in place to facilitate the relocation of Air Canada and Alaska Airline's Baggage Service Offices

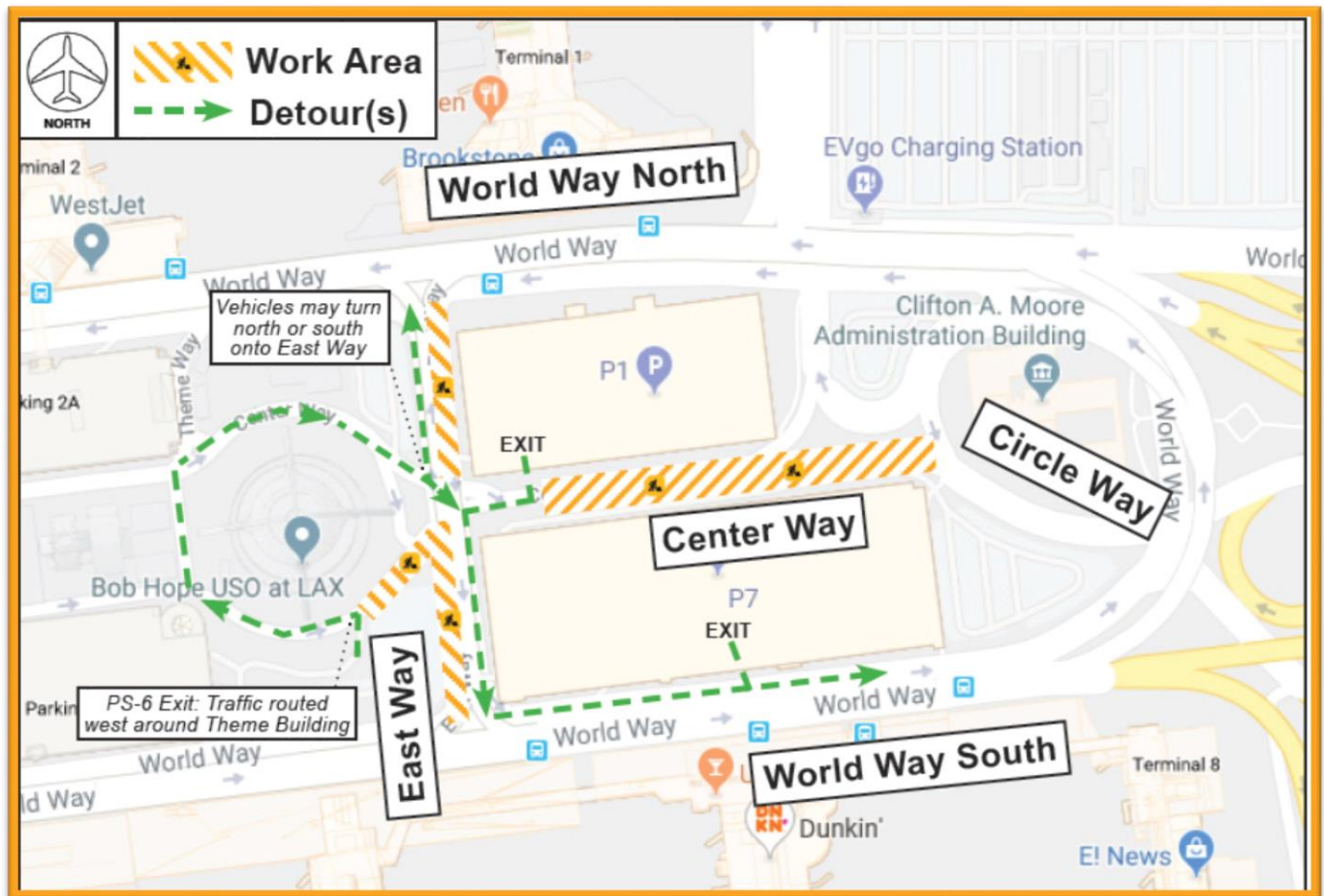

2. Center Way Closure

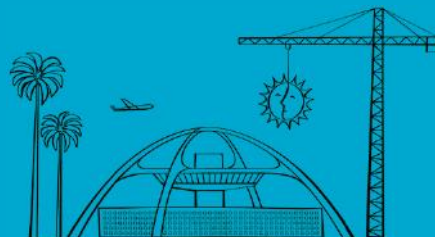
- Center Way from East Way to Circle Way (between Parking Structures 1 and 7) will be fully closed on Thursday, September 19 from 1AM to 5AM to facilitate the removal of overhead signage in preparation for Automated People Mover construction
- Detour signage will be in place; traffic will be maintained at all times
- Upon removal of the overhead sign, temporary signage with necessary information will be in place on either side of Center Way

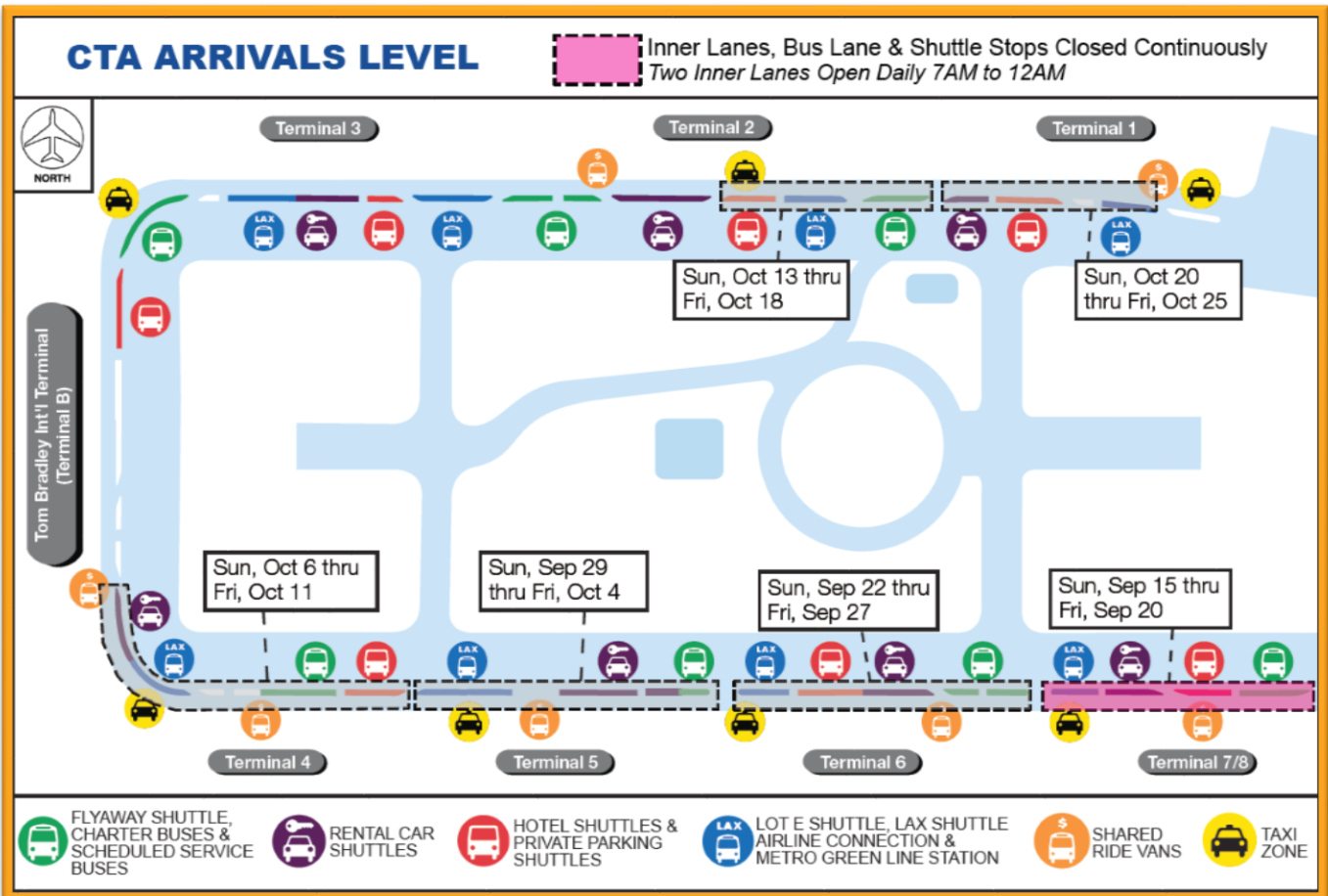

3. CTA Arrivals Level Shuttle Stop Curb Extension

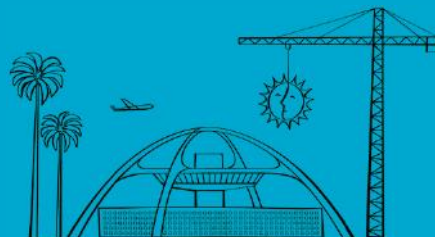
- The Interim Ground Access project will restrict portions of the Arrivals Level Inner Lanes, Bus Lane and shuttle stops through Friday, October 25 to widen the curb at the shuttle stop islands
- Work this week will be performed at Terminals 7 and 8
- Traffic is maintained and signage will be posted guiding pedestrians to the next available shuttle stop as necessary

4. Terminal 1.5 Construction Update

- Construction continues airside on “Terminal 1.5” – the connector building between Terminals 1 and 2 that will provide additional passenger ticking and baggage check-in areas, increased security screening, a secure passenger connection between the two terminals, and more
- Construction is scheduled to reach a major project milestone this week when the building is “topped off” on Wednesday, September 18 , meaning the last piece of large steel for the building will be erected
